Prohibited		Do not leave this equipment unattended while running.			
Activitie	Activities				
Steps to be taken to complete task safely:					
1	Wear appro	opriate personal protective equipment (PPE).			
2	Make all adjustments with POWER OFF.				
3	Make sure all guards are in place, properly adjusted, and secured.				
4	Hold reciprocating saw with both hands.				
5	Secure and support stock as close as possible to the cutting line to avoid vibration.				
6	Keep the base, or shoe, of the saw in firm contact with the stock being cut.				
7	Select the correct blade for the material being cut and allow it to cut steadily. Do not force it. Clean and sharp blades operate best.				
8	Set the blade to go no further than 0.32 to 0.64 cm (1/8 to 1!4 inch) deeper than the material being cut.				

9	Do not start cutting until the saw reaches its full power.				
10	Do not force a saw along or around a curve. Allow the machine to turn with ease.				
11	Do not insert a blade into or withdraw a blade from a cut or lead hole while the blade is moving.				
12	Do not put down a saw until the motor has stopped.				
13	Do not reach under or around the stock being cut.				
14	Maintain control of the saw always. Avoid cutting above shoulder height				
15	Clean up dust and debris with POWER OFF.				
	If an emergency occurs while conducting this task, or there is an equipment malfunction, shut the equipment off immediately and follow the lock out procedure.				
	REPORT ANY HAZARDOUS SITUATION TO YOUR INSTRUCTOR/SUPERVISOR IMMEDIATELY				
	 Housekeeping Ensure equipment is off. When servicing equipment (ex. changing a blade), power must be disconnected. Ensure the equipment is safe, clean and tidy before you leave it.
