1. September 22, 2022 Board Meeting, held at the NBCC Miramichi Campus; and
2. October 20-21, 2022 Board Retreat, held at the NBCC Woodstock Campus.

The following are highlights of these meetings:

September 22, 2022:

- The Board reviewed and approved [NBCC's 2021-2022 Annual Report](#). The approved Report was delivered to the Minister of Post-Secondary Education, Training and Labour on September 29th.
- The Board received an update on the development of the **NBCC 2023-2028 Strategic Plan**.
- The Board undertook a strategic review of the **2021-2022 Performance Measurement Dashboard**.
- The Governors were delighted to receive a tour of the **Centre of Excellence for Community and Protective Services**, led by Karen White-O'Connell, NBCC's Dean for Arts, Community & Protective Services.

October 20-21, 2022:

- The Board met for their Annual Fall Retreat.
- The Board enjoyed a tour of the Woodstock Campus.
- On the afternoon of October 20th, the Board received updates on initiatives in serving our Indigenous communities, international enrolment and the *Going Beyond* capital campaign.
- On the morning of October 21st, the Board was excited to review the final draft of **NBCC's 2023-2028 Strategic Plan**. The Strategic Plan will be sent to the Minister of Post-Secondary Education, Training and Labour for final approval.
- On the afternoon of October 21st, the Board was delighted to welcome members of the College Leadership Team to learn more about transforming post-secondary education and what this means for NBCC.
